

OKLAHOMA COVID-19**Created October 15, 2021 – Reviewed 01-19-2022****State of Emergency**

On May 4, 2021, by [Executive Order 2021-11](#), the [Second Amended Executive Order 2021-07](#) has been rescinded. There is no longer a state of emergency declaration. Further, there are no additional orders relating to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Liability Immunity

On May 21, 2020, the Governor approved [SB 1946](#), which states “a person or agent of the person who conducts business within Oklahoma shall not be liable in a civil action claiming an injury from exposure or potential exposure to COVID-19 if the act or omission alleged to violate a duty of care of the person or agent of person was in compliance or consistent to Federal or State regulations, a Presidential or Gubernatorial Executive Order”. This Act was in full force and in effect once signed. Immunity only applies to civil actions filed on or after the effective date of the Act.
